## Our History Celebrating 55+ Years

Our agency officially began in 1969 when we gained recognition as a non-profit and began serving the community under the name Matsqui-Sumas Abbotsford (MSA) Community Services.

Led by our founder Walter Paetkau, the early group of volunteers and staff began by running a Christmas Bureau program and creating a directory of services. Other early programs included recycling, counselling, the Minikin Market, Legal Aid, and Meals on Wheels.

The agency became known as Matsqui-Abbotsford Community Services in 1972 and Abbotsford Community Services (ACS) in 1995 following district amalgamations.

Over the years, more programs were added to meet community needs including the Abbotsford Food Bank, Interpretation & Translation Services, and the Abbotsford Addictions Centre. We have also played a pivotal role in welcoming newcomers from around the world. Programs such as the Family Centre, Youth Resource Centre and Community Living provide individualized supports to walk alongside individuals.

We've continued to grow and create partnerships. In 2017, we opened Abbotsford's first low-barrier housing facility. We are the lead agency of one of the first Foundry sites, which opened in 2018 and provides health and wellness services for youth.

During our 50th anniversary in 2019, we changed the agency name to "Archway Community Services" to shift from a geographic focus to a statement of vision and purpose.

As we move forward, we continue to respond to people's needs, especially during times of uncertainty. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic and in the midst of disastrous flooding, our doors remained open, and staff pivoted to continue supporting their clients.

Archway has come a long way since its early days - from a group of committed volunteers to now having more than 550 staff, 2,000+ volunteers and 90+ programs. Our growth has been possible through the visionary oversight of our board and leaders, the expertise and passion of staff and volunteers, as well as the fortitude of some truly remarkable community partners.


