Celebrating 50 Years

In the mid-1960s, Walter Paetkau was working for the Mennonite Conference in service development. He formed an ad-hoc committee of community representatives who began the Christmas Bureau in 1967 and started other projects, including the printing of a directory of community resources for people seeking help of almost any kind.

In 1969, their efforts were made official when Matsqui-Sumas-Abbotsford (MSA) Community Services registered as a society. Working from a small office on Essendene Avenue, the group of committed citizens volunteered their time and expertise to help those in need.

A lot has changed over the last five decades as the community and the organization have grown. There are now over 90 programs currently running including multicultural, counselling, recycling, food bank, seniors and youth services. ACS has expanded to sites throughout Abbotsford, satellite offices in the Fraser Valley plus pre-arrival immigrant services in India.

Walter retired from his post as Executive Director in 2000. During his 31-year tenure, the organization was known as Matsqui-Abbotsford (M-A) Community Services from 1972 – 1995 and then became Abbotsford Community Services (ACS) in 1995.

It's been 50 years since that group of concerned citizens started the Christmas Bureau and other services, but from day one to today, it's always been about **people helping people.**

Abbotsford Community Services Food Bank

The Food Bank provides food, basic necessities, dental care, and emergency assistance for individuals and families in need. Please see the full list of programs below.

All Kids Play Sports

Through community partnerships, we connect families who use the Food Bank to local camps at little or no cost.

Basics for Babies

Baby supplies such as diapers and formula are available to parents in Abbotsford who live in a low-income household.

Christmas Bureau

The Christmas Bureau offers food hampers, gifts, and clothing to families and children in need during the Christmas season. Available for families already accessing the Food Bank and for those in temporary crisis.



Dental Clinic

Free basic dental coverage is available to people who live in a low-income household and have little or no dental coverage.

Emergency Food

Hampers are distributed on an emergency basis and to registered guests monthly. The size of the food hamper varies depending on the size of the family. You can expect to find a variety of fresh and non-perishable food items.


Medical Transportation
